

To the Public in general.

VINCENT N. PELOSI takes this method to inform his friends and the public in general, that he intends the first of January, 1785, to open a COFFEE HOUSE, the south side of Market-Street, between Front and Second-streets, under the name of Pennsylvania; where gentlemen, at every hour, may be accommodated with Breakfasts, Dinners or Suppers, American or Italian chocolate, coffee always fresh made, even by the single cup, wines of every sort, liquors, French and Italian cordials, capillaire, orgeat, &c. &c. &c. and for the better accommodation, an ordinary will be on the table every day precisely at two and at one on Sundays. A directory will be kept in the coffee room, to be renewed yearly, containing an alphabetical list of the names and places of abode of the merchants, and principal traders of the city of Philadelphia; for which purpose V. N. Pelosi solicits the favor of the gentlemen to deliver at the bar, their names, trade or profession, with the place of abode. Likewise another book will be opened to the public, where merchants, brokers and captains of vessels may register the ship news. All the newspapers published in the city, current price, acts of assembly, &c. &c. will be constantly kept. The public advertisements, notices, letters, &c. &c. to be delivered at the bar, where proper care will be taken of them.
